The following is a list of the seven deadly sins to choose from:

- *Avarice/Greed
- *Envy/Jealousy
- *Gluttony (habit or act of eating too much)
- *Lust
- *Revenge
- *Sloth/Laziness
- *Vanity (overconcern with one's appearance or beauty)
