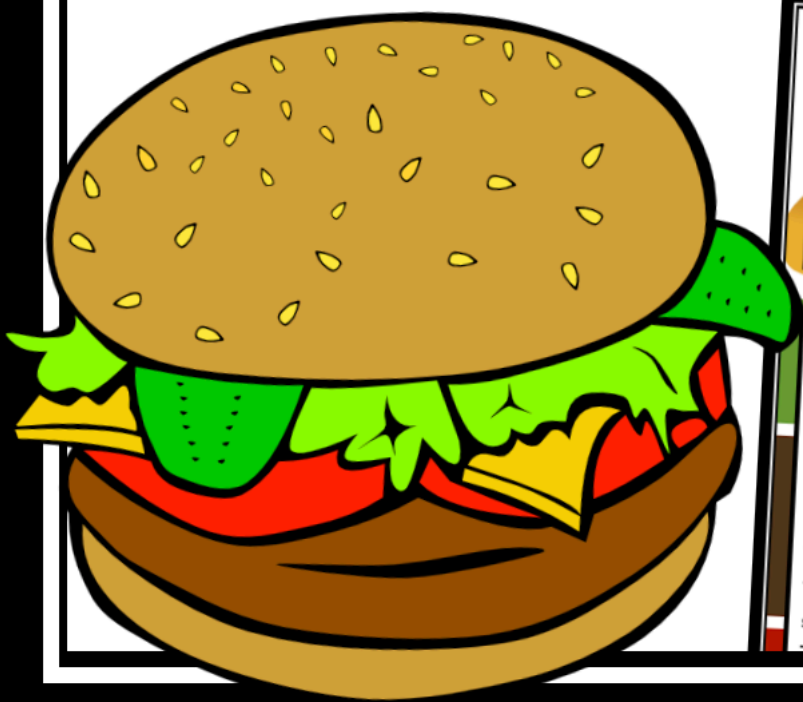

ACADEMIC DICTIONARY

When you write formally, you want to try to avoid weak words and expressions. Although you can't eliminate them all, if you use more formal words and expressions in their place, your paper will sound much better.

AVOID THESE WEAK VERBS:

Am, is, are, be, was, were (etc), gets, shows, makes, seems, uses, appears



OTHER WORDS TO AVOID:

Lots, a lot, well, fine, so, fun, great, very, said, got, very, nice, good, just, like, feel, kind of, sort of, for some reason, I think, I feel, personally, I believe, it seems to me, in which, maybe, seems, perhaps, thing, really

It is important to maintain an intellectual voice! It pays to sound like you know what you are talking about. Try using some of these verbs instead when analyzing.
